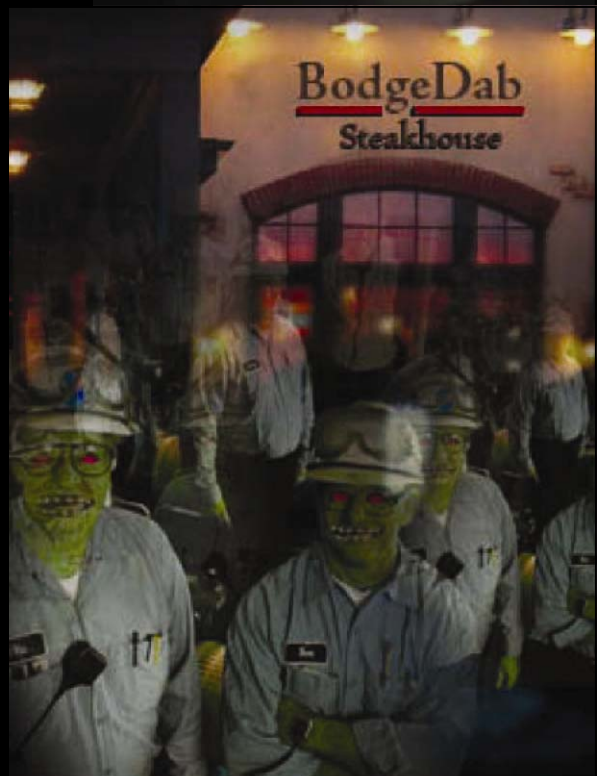
To save more workers from turning into zombies and prevent the evil Damballa Bokor from taking over the world, you need to work with the game's safety professionals to fix the hazards using the tools you collect throughout the game.

When you start the game, remember there are several safety professionals available by phone to help you figure out how to deal with the hazards. If you are unsure of how to fix a hazard, ask one of them for help. Use the tools you pick up and add to your inventory to fix the hazardous situations in each level. More instructions are available within the game. Help keep workers safe and zombie free!

Currently nearly 70 teens under the age of 18 die from work-related injuries and another 77,000 teen workers end up in hospital emergency rooms each year.

This game is another tool available to teens and to you to prevent future incidents, by learning from a fun educational medium. Share this game in schools, at work, and in communities to educate young workers about being safe on the job.
