

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, every day millions of people go to and return home from work safely; due in part to the efforts of occupational safety, health and environmental professionals – working day in and day out to identify hazards and implement safety and health advances in all industries and at all workplaces, aimed at eliminating workplace fatalities, injuries, and illnesses; and

WHEREAS, the week of May 2 - 8, 2010, has been designated as “North American Occupational Safety and Health (NAOSH) Week” by the American Society of Safety Engineers members and corporate/association partners. The NAOSH theme for 2010 is “**Mission NAOSH 2010: Safe Workplaces**”.

WHEREAS, a countrywide effort is being made to increase employers’, employees’, and the public’s understanding and awareness of the importance of occupational safety and health to workers returning home each day to their families, injury and illness free; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, John H. Land, Mayor of Apopka, Florida, do hereby proclaim the week of May 2 - 8, 2010 to be:


“NORTH AMERICAN OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH WEEK”
